## A School with a Difference

Bharatiya Vidya Bhavan's Public School, Jubilee Hills was inaugurated by His Holiness Swami Ranganathanandaji on 5th July 1979. The Vidyashram is inspired by the ideals and objectives of the Bhavan's faith, which stands for the reintegration of Indian culture, synthesizing the ancient but ever relevant and enduring spiritual values of India adapted to the needs and requirements of the modern times.



## Kulapati KM Munshi

*'India will once again be acknowledged as the Vishwa guru  
- a superpower that embodies the ideals of  
vasudhaiva kutumbakam - the global family.'*

As a young man, Kanhaiyalal Maneklal Munshi was imbued with a sense of India's greatness. Not yet out of his teens, he learnt from his mother's songs and stories about the sages and seers of India's past.

Like most others of his generation and class, Munshi took to the study of law and rose to the pinnacle of his profession even in the era of legal giants. It was but natural that law led to politics and politics to the service of the country's heritage. The call of Mahatma Gandhi for sacrifice led to Munshi bidding goodbye to his lucrative practice and prepared to risk his all in the fight against injustice to his country.

He regarded India's independence in 1947 as an opportunity for an ascent once again. He believed that the people of India had the gift of idealism and realism in them to climb up into a new millennium. Munshi showed that a man with pride in the past could also have faith in the future through the instruments of science and technology. Today when the world is so conscious of the environment and of ecological factors, it is edifying to note that as much as half a century ago, Munshi's Vanamahotsava scheme heralded the impulse for preserving ecology. Munshi's vision was as deep as it was vast.

Munshi was keen to set in motion ongoing constructive measures to foster and strengthen the creative, cultural and educational foundations of the Indian Nation with the active participation of the citizens from all castes, communities and regions through broad based selfless, voluntary, totally apolitical organization supported by the goodwill and co-operation of the government. Therefore, Munshi conceived of Bharatiya Vidya Bhavan in 1937, a decade before the advent of Independence.

Towards this end, Munshi, with the blessings of Mahatma Gandhi and active support and co-operation of several eminent leaders founded the Bharatiya Vidya Bhavan as a national organization, nay movement, with an international outlook. This was in 1938.

The Bharatiya Vidya Bhavan was officially registered on November 7, 1938.





## Bhavan's Faith

Let me once again set forth the Bhavan's faith for the benefit of new students and members, for it is necessary that they should understand it clearly and imbibe its spirit.

The Bhavan stands for the reintegration of Indian culture. In a world falling to pieces under the impact of technological avalanche, it tries to hold fast to the fundamental values for which our culture stands - RITA, SATYA, YAGNA and TAPAS:

**FAITH** in God who in-forms the Cosmic Order;

**TRUTH** which is accord between mind, word and deed;



# Infrastructure

## The Campus:

Located in the picturesque area, Jubilee Hills, the school has a vibrant campus spread over an area of 8.02 acres. Abundant greenery, a small pet corner, tastefully and artistically designed Gazibo and the school's close proximity to Kasu Brahmananda Reddy National Park make the school environs pollution free and a delightful place of learning.

Three impressive buildings in the campus house brightly lit, airy and well furnished classrooms, laboratories, a conference hall and staffrooms.

The school is well equipped with closed Circuit Camera Television for effective surveillance and security of the students and the staff.





# Academic Facilities

## **Laboratories:**

The school has spacious and well equipped laboratories for Physics, Chemistry, Biology and Mathematics as well as a General Science Laboratory for the Middle School.

## **Computer Lab:**

The school has a separate computer lab for the primary and senior block. The Lab is centrally air-conditioned and provided with Internet facility. Students are permitted to use it under the supervision of the teachers. Resource Rooms in the school are well equipped with audio/video facility, L.C.D projector screens etc. Teaching-Learning is made interactive through the use of latest technology.

## **Smart Board Equipped Classrooms:**

In order to make the teaching / learning process interesting and innovative each classroom from Class IV to Class XII, is equipped with a smart board / TV where in the teachers co-relate the day to day academics with audio-visuals incorporating the CBSE syllabus and giving a wide range of learning experiences to the students.

## **English Language Lab:**

A well equipped English Language Laboratory with all the accessories is a perfect platform in training the students with soft skills. Students have wide exposure of variety of listening and speaking skills.

## **School Library:**

To facilitate reading, the school has separate Library sections for Primary and Senior blocks. The evergrowing school library is the knowledge hub of all academic activities. The vast collection of books in English, Hindi and Telugu includes classics, fiction, self-help books, educational magazines, books and journals on science and technology, history and culture. The school also subscribes to local and national dailies in English, Hindi and Telugu. Students are encouraged to read the books and utilize the library services for gathering information for assignments, projects and competitions. To inculcate good reading habits each class from classes LKG to Class V has been provided with its own Class Library stocked with books suited to its age and level.

## **Stationery Shop :**

A stationery in the school premises functions during the school hours. Students can shop for all their academic needs, during the break.

## **Amphitheatre:**

An exclusive place to organize literary activities like quiz/debate/role play etc.

## **ATAL Tinkering Lab :**

The 'Atal Tinkering Laboratory' of the School trains the students to develop scientific models by combining electronics and programming. ATL used in the school to foster an environment of innovation and creativity by exposing children to various 21st century skills using resources available in the Atal Tinkering Lab.



# Curriculum

The school is affiliated to Central Board of Secondary Education, New Delhi.

The curriculum is well planned, graded and innovative as per National Education Policy (NEP). The school is a co-educational school with English as medium of instruction. A student completes 15 years of schooling in the following stages i.e. Pre-Primary, Primary, Middle, Secondary and Senior Secondary.

## PRE-PRIMARY

### School is Fun :

The play-way method grooms the young minds to face the world confidently and kindles their creativity.

The first six years of a child's life are the most critical years for lifelong development, since the pace of development in these years is extremely rapid. The Pre-Primary block provides care, opportunities and experiences that lead to the all-round development of the students. The classes are embedded in a stimulating and enriching physical and psycho social environment. Fine motor development, hand and eye coordination, self-help skills etc are learnt through play-way methods. This leads to a sound foundation for life.

### Graduation :

Kindergarten Graduation ceremony is conducted at the end of upper kindergarten. Certificates are awarded to the 'Little Graduates'.





## PRIMARY: (Class I - V)

The stronger the roots, the more stable is the tree. Hence, in the primary block equal importance is given to physical, emotional, spiritual and psychological well-being of a student. All activities are centered around the creativity and spontaneity of the students. The wide variety of work-experiences give opportunity for students to nurture their talents. True to Bhavan's philosophy, all festivals are given equal importance and celebrated traditionally. Students love their second home and look forward to be present each day.

## MIDDLE SCHOOL: (Class VI - VIII)

The methodology adopted at the middle school level of education stresses on interactive learning through activities, projects etc. The students are evaluated on a regular basis. Conventional as well as result-oriented methods are adopted in the classroom.

## SECONDARY SCHOOL

All activities and events are planned to foster creativity, innovation and critical thinking. Students are encouraged to hone problem-solving, adaptability, collaboration skills and right values, ensuring students blossom into responsible youngsters. The basic core subjects are English, Mathematics, Science, Social Sciences, Hindi/ Sanskrit/ Telugu and Artificial Intelligence.

### Senior Secondary School: (XI & XII)

The students are nurtured with leadership qualities, ethical values and social responsibility. The main objective is to prepare students for higher education, take up different careers, foster decision-making, teamwork, and moral integrity alongside academic excellence. The curriculum is based on CBSE Pattern. The School offers the following streams in Classes XI and XII.

# Evaluation System

## **Primary:**

The students are evaluated in scholastic and co-scholastic areas by school based assessment that covers all the aspects of a student's development.

## **Middle School:**

The school follows a uniform system of evaluation pattern in scholastic and non scholastic areas for class VI to VIII and class IX and XI as per CBSE guidelines.

## **Secondary & Senior Secondary School :**

Students of Class-X appear for Secondary School Examination (SSE) and students of class-XII appear for Senior Secondary School Examination (SSSE) at the end of the academic year.

## **Competitive Exams:**

The school conducts various competitive exams, seminars, workshops for the students on various educational themes.

## **Dance and Music:**

Formal training is given to students in dance & music from pre-primary stage of education. Students get ample opportunity to showcase their talents during the celebration of various events in the school.





# Co-Curricular Activities for Diverse Learning to Holistic Development

## Sports Activity :

Students acquire skills in the following activities: Rifle Shooting, Skating, Gymnastics, Aerobics, Archery, Basket Ball, Cricket, Volleyball, Table Tennis etc.

## Newspaper in Education Programme :

Newspapers in Education (NIE) is a Young Reader Development' initiative that involves the use of newspapers in schools for purposes of improving literacy and developing a reading culture among children. NIE programme also aims to create social awareness and good citizenry among children through newspaper reading. Our students enjoy reading the student edition of 'The Hindu' and 'Times NIE'. Young writers also get the opportunity to hone their creative writing skills and are delighted to find their articles getting published in newspapers regularly.

## Value Addition Activities:

The School strikes a fine balance between modernity and tradition.

- Chanting of slokas and meditation form an integral part of the curriculum. On one hand, the school celebrates all the festivals with traditional fervour and on the other hand, technology-aided learning plays a major role in the process of pedagogy.
- Yoga keeps the body fit and supple. It promotes harmony between mind and body. A well trained Yoga guru trains the students to practice Yoga in a spacious Yoga centre.

## Community Outreach:

The school involves students in various community service programmes such as environmental awareness and help students of Vidyashram to bond with students of underprivileged schools and spread awareness regarding health and hygiene. Students of the School donate generously for various 'Social Causes' like for Orphanages, old age home, under privileged schools. Akshayapatra (Annadanam), Nanhi Kali Project by K C Mahindra Trust and maintenance of an endangered species at Nehru Zoological Park. 'Joy of Giving Week' is observed in the school every year.



## Awakened Citizen Programme:

The ACP programme by Ramakrishna Math is conducted for the student of classes 7 and 8 as part of value education.

### Life Skills:

A Student Prefectorial Board is constituted to involve the students in planning, organizing and implementing all the activities of the school under the guidance of the teachers, thus, inculcating in them leadership qualities and a sense of responsibility towards their school, friends and themselves.

### Educational Trips, Adventure Camps and Excursions:

Educational Trips, Adventure Camps and Excursions, (Local as well as Outstation) are arranged for all the students on a regular basis for educational and recreational purposes.

### STUDENT SUPPORT

- Counsellor & Wellness Teacher: A professional counsellor provides counselling to students, parents and teachers on personal matters and group behaviour. The school also has a Special Educator for slow learners in the primary block.
- Healthcare: The school believes in 'Prevention is better than Cure'. Hence to promote healthy eating habits, one day in a week is observed compulsorily as a 'Nutrition Day'. The school also arranges for regular Dental, Eye and General Health Check-ups for the students in the school campus.



## Guidelines for Withdrawals and Refunds

- i) Parent who wishes to withdraw his/her child must submit an application form in the school office.
- ii) Application for a Transfer Certificate must be submitted before 31st March.
- iii) In case of withdrawal from school, it is obligatory for parent to give a clear calendar month's notice in writing, and make settlement of dues of the school up to the date of leaving.
- iv) For application received after 31st March, the parent needs to pay the fees for the next quarter.
- v) A minimum of one week, from the date of submission of withdrawal form, will be required to issue the Transfer Certificate.
- vi) Discontinuation from school without prior intimation and nonpayment of School fees will lead to non-issuance of Transfer Certificate.
- vii) Full Fee has to be paid in case of a child who is on long leave or absent (with permission of the school authority).
- viii) The school bus facility if availed must be continued throughout the year. Mid-term withdrawals and refunds with regard to the school bus fees will not be entertained. However, under unavoidable circumstances withdrawal of school bus facility may be allowed at the end of the term, provided such a request is given in writing and approval taken from the Principal in advance.
- ix) In case a student leaves the school for such compulsion as transfer of parents or for health reason or in case of death of the student before completion of the session, prorata return of quarterly/term/annual fees will be made.
- x) The school management reserves the exclusive right to revise the structure of the school fees.

## ADMISSIONS

- i) Registration for admissions into Nursery begin in the month of January / February for the academic year beginning from April. Age accepted for admission into Nursery is 3 plus as on 31st May. An authentic certificate of Date of Birth is an essential requirement at the time of registration.
- ii) Schedule regarding admissions to classes, other than Nursery will be updated on the school Notice Board in the month of March.
- iii) Admission forms will be issued subject to the availability of the vacancies in the respective classes.
- iv) Parents should fill in the application forms with utmost accuracy. No subsequent changes will be permitted for any reason whatsoever. (Details for Board Registrations for classes-IX, X, XI and XII will be made as per the data provided in Birth Certificate and admission application form).
- v) At the time of admission a student who attended a recognized school earlier must submit a Transfer Certificate issued by the earlier school. In case of students migrating from other states the transfer certificate must be countersigned by the concerned District Inspector of schools of the respective State/Regional Officer CBSE from where the student has migrated. (Details for CBSE Board Registrations will be made from the entries made in the Transfer Certificate only).
- vi) Candidates belonging to other categories i.e. B.C/S.C/S.T/minority etc., should submit authentic caste certificate at the time of Registration.
- vii) Students seeking admission into class-IX must produce a certificate that they have studied any two Indian languages in addition to English.
- viii) The decision of the school authorities regarding admission is final and binding.



## Mode of Payments

- ❖ Outstation cheques will not be accepted.
- ❖ All fees is payable in advance.
- ❖ The last date for payment of fee is 20th of each quarter ie in the month of April, August and December.
- ❖ If the fee with fine is not paid by the stipulated date the pupil's name will be deleted from the rolls. The student will be re-admitted only after obtaining permission from the Principal and charged a fee of Rs. 2,000/- for re-admission.
- ❖ Fee challan will be supplied to every student in advance by the Accounts Department.
- ❖ The date of realization of the cheque will be treated as date of payment. If the cheque is dishonoured and payment is not made before the due date, late fee will be charged as prescribed. Additional amount of Rs. 200/- will be collected for dishonoured cheques.
- ❖ Parents will retain their copy of the fee challan with them and produce it as and when required by the Accounts Department for verification.
- ❖ Cheques duly crossed should be drawn in favour of Bharatiya vidya bhavan's public school, Jubilee Hills, Hyderabad.
- ❖ Parents have the option of depositing the fee for the whole year in advance if they find it more convenient.
- ❖ Parents can pay School Fee through NEFT also.




## SCHOOL TRANSPORT
